Notes for Guidance (Glasshouse)

A. "Glasshouse" includes any fixed or mobile structure of a height sufficient to allow persons to enter in an upright position and which is glazed or clad with film or rigid plastics or other glass substitutes. In the case of mobile structures return only the area covered by the structures themselves and not the total area of the sites that could be covered by moving the structures.

B. Enter at items 250-251 any fixed or mobile structures covered by glass or by glazed lights. Exclude Dutch lights used as frames on the flat, cloches and Dutch light structures unglazed at the date of return.

C. Enter at items 252-253 any fixed or mobile structures covered by film or rigid plastics or other glass substitutes providing the plastic cladding is in a satisfactory state for crop production. Exclude cloches, low tunnels and other forms of plastic coverage which do not allow people to enter in an upright position, or which are not capable of completely covering the crop as necessary.

D. (i) "Tomatoes, heated crop" means plants being grown with the aid of artificial heat during the whole or part life of the planted out crop.

(ii) "Tomatoes, unheated crop" means plants being grown without the aid of artificial heat after planting.
